

Trick-or-Treating is On!

WHAT TO EXPECT AND HOW TO KEEP YOUR FAMILY AND OUR COMMUNITY SAFE

The Delaware General Health District has issued the following guidelines for having a safe Trick-or-Treat.

If your children are trick-or-treating this year or you'd like to pass out candy at your home, Orange Township requests participants follow a few simple rules:

TRICK-OR TREATERS

- Wear a mask. Trick-or-treaters and any attending adults must wear masks, either as part of their costumes or separately.
- Stay with your group. Trick-or-treaters should remain with families or groups as they go from house to house.
- Social distance. Keep at least 6 feet away from other trick-or-treating groups.
- Take turns. Only one group of trick-or-treaters should be at someone's door at a time. If there's already a group at someone's door, wait for them to leave before you proceed.

CANDY GIVERS

- Wear a mask.
- Wash your hands prior to handing out candy and keep them clean throughout trick-or-treating.
- Put candy directly into trick-or-treaters' bags yourself. Do not allow kids to select or touch the candy themselves.
- Only hand out pre-packaged store-bought candy.



Please continue to practice general safety precautions; do not trick-or-treat or hand out candy if you're not feeling well and consult a physician first if you're at higher risk for infection or complications. *A few practical precautions can go a long way, so we invite you all to be safe and have fun!*

TRUNK-OR-TREAT EVENT TIPS

If you're hosting, supporting, or volunteering at a trunk-or-treat event, below are additional precautions to keep our families safe and your event running smoothly.

- Keep events neighborhood focused and pre-register attendees for a given time frame to help crowd control.
- Let people know in advance what to expect and promote your event with this information so attendees can prepare and participate safely.
- Use distance markers to ensure plenty of space between the trunk-or-treat vehicles.
